
A Note From the Director

At face value, this quirky love story tells us what we already know: love hurts. Kayleen and Doug seem to be made for each other, but can never get it together enough to actually be together. I'm not sure love is so simple. Do the traumas of childhood, adolescence, and adulthood become like stones in our pockets, weighing us down over a lifetime? Do we find ways in time to set those stones down, or - for the luckiest of us - someone to help us carry them? Is the pain we feel in our many attempts at love as painful as falling off a roof, losing an eye, or cutting out our own stomachs? Suddenly, this far-fetched tale seems - at least allegorically - completely sensible.

Bonded through friendship, blood, and a connection that can only be felt, Kayleen and Doug *get* each other. All great love stories have this in common: someone says "I see you, faults and all, and I am all in." May we *all* find that level of love and acceptance - with a few less injuries along the way.

Connor Brenes (Doug)




